Snohomish County Community Asset Mapping (CAM) Coalition

In January of 2014, a Steering Committee of the Snohomish County CAM workgroup met to plan a facilitated community discussion with the goal of "Identifying every child, birth to six years of age, in Snohomish County and Camano Island who has a delay or disability in their development as early as possible. This facilitated community discussion was held on June 23, 2014.

Initial Activities:

- Develop broad-based Steering Committee with representation from key stakeholders, including community foundations and funders, and links to all populations, especially the most vulnerable
- Identify and review existing data for how many young children are in Snohomish
 County, when and how children are being identified with delays and helped into services
- Identify or conduct focus groups or surveys with a variety of providers who serve young children and families with young children.

Current Activities:

- Snohomish County has created a structure for their coalition that includes three
 workgroups based on the community's identified priorities emerging from the initial
 CAM meeting. These workgroups meet on a regular basis and report to the Steering
 Committee that meets quarterly.
- Snohomish County CAM work has embraced three priorities:
 - 1. Ensure training for healthcare providers regarding how to do screening and how to talk with families about results and concerns.
 - 2. Enhance connections with families and healthcare providers through outreach/communication, information, and resource identification.
 - 3. Improve outreach and access to families in Snohomish County who are underserved and at risk.

Products:

- Surveys of families, health care providers and other service providers who care for young children in Snohomish County. (2014)
