Autism: Finding Lewis County Answers

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Signs of Autism

- Not returning your smile or back & forth responses
- Not liking to cuddle
- Lack of eye contact
- Not responding to simple directions
- Not responding to name
- Seems distant
- Rocks/flaps hands
- Suddenly stops talking
- Not pointing or using gestures
- Not babbling by twelve months old
- Not using single words by sixteen months old
- Not using two word phrases by two years old
