

# SMART Team/Coalition Yearly Update Oct 1, 2022- Sept 30, 2023

- 17 teams or coalitions provided updates 25 respondents from 20 counties
- Typically, 1-3 active COEs per group, but some much bigger
- Wide variation in ages seen across birth through adulthood- most teams see children under 11.
- At least 789 children evaluated in Oct 2022-Sept 2023 (and probably a big undercount)
- Median percentage of evaluated children receiving an autism diagnosis 80% (range 44-95%)

#### What's worked well this past year?

- Incorporating non-COE providers as part of the evaluation process
- Incorporating Complexity/ Triage process for who to evaluate and how (thank you Heather Buzbee!) – and who to refer elsewhere
- Improving communication and coordination process for evaluations with all partners
- Community Health Workers and Autism Resource Navigators; working closely with Parent to Parent
- Expanding assessment capacity (tools STAT, ADOS, CASD and people to do).
- Developing team materials
- Demonstrating that over the past year the majority of our autism evaluation visits have been reimbursed!

#### Challenges

- Money, time, people
- Partnering with school districts
- Challenging for providers to invest the time to learn a new workflow for autism evals
- <u>Fear</u> of starting an evaluation program and not having the appropriate resources for follow up care and **lack of SLP/OT/ABA and other local resources for families**
- Recruiting enough COEs to participate in the work
- Getting paperwork back from families –takes coordinator a lot of time to follow up
- DDA rules not recognizing an Autism DX from a Naturopathic Doctor COE
- Need for more clinician diagnostic tools and training
- Post COVID, health care providers AND families are overwhelmed; turnover and changes
  in who is involved.

#### Support needs

- Legislative action for better reimbursement from HCA
- Administrative buy- in to allow some providers to decrease overall pt encounter numbers to focus on this work
- **Funding** for outreach, for tools, for training (including ADOS, STAT, RIT...), for salaries of team members
- CME and other training to continue to build skills
- Professional development for Care Navigation and funding for Resource Navigator role helping both families and COEs
- Continued mentoring and support from central staff and other teams
- Finding a way for patients who don't already have an IEP to get cognitive evaluations
- How to use community volunteers/parents
- Be allowed to provide Seattle Children's Accessing Treatment, Learning and Support (ATLAS) class locally with local volunteers

## What you want to know from other SMART Communities....

- How you've adapted the SMART model to your community Team structures, process, workflows and outreach materials; assessment tools used
- How to connect with and get buy in from school districts; how to form partnerships with schools; how to communicate about need for psychological testing for some patients?
- How do you engage parents? How do you get paperwork efficiently back from families?
- How are you putting <u>support services into place for children</u> with diagnoses and <u>what</u>
  resources are you sharing with families? How are you <u>paying</u> for person to help families
  post diagnosis?
- How do you track diagnostic fidelity over time?
- How to prevent burnout, including not having one or two providers with too heavy a load
- How are you handling wait lists for your evaluations?
